The following information is being provided to help Minority Business Enterprises (MBEs) Women-Owned Business Enterprises (WBEs) and/or Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises (DVBEs) to better understand Columbia St. Mary's (CSM) Supplier Diversity Program, as well as to develop a working relationship between Columbia St. Mary's and diverse suppliers.

It is our philosophy to promote positive supplier relationships through courtesy and impartiality in all phases of the selection process.

About Columbia St. Mary's Supplier Diversity Program

Throughout CSM, Supplier diversity is a reflection of our Values and the health system's desire to sustain and improve the physical, spiritual and economic health of the communities we serve.

First Step: Complete Supplier Profile

Your completion of the supplier profile and placement into our database is not a "guarantee" that your company will be awarded specific contracts/purchases, but it is a required "first step" in the Supplier Diversity Program.

Definitions and Classifications

Certification - We strongly encourage certification since this process identifies bona fide minority- or woman-owned business enterprises.

Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise (DVBE) - A business that is at least 51% owned, operated and controlled by one or more disabled veterans.

Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) - To meet the definition of an MBE, a business must be 51% owned, operated and controlled by minority group members.

Woman-Owned Business Enterprise (WBE) - An enterprise that, regardless of ethnic background, is at least 51% owned, operated and controlled by women members.

Minority Group Members

African-American - US. citizens having origins in any of the Black racial groups of Africa.

Asian-Indian American - US. citizens whose origins are in India, Pakistan and Bangladesh.

Asian-Pacific American - US. citizens whose country of origin is Japan, China, Taiwan, Korea, Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia, the Philippines, Samoa, Guam, the U.S. Trust Territories of the Pacific or the Northern Marianas, Indonesia, Micronesia, or Polynesia.

Hispanic-American - U.S. citizens of true-born Hispanic heritage (true-born meaning "authentically" or "genuinely" as per Webster's Dictionary), from any of the Spanish speaking areas of Latin America or the following regions: Mexico, Central America, South America and the Caribbean basin.

Native-American - A person who is an American Indian, Eskimo, Aleut or Native Hawaiian, and regarded as such by the community of which the person claims to be a part. Native Americans must be documented members of a North American tribe, band or otherwise organized group of native people who are indigenous to the continental United States and proof can be provided through a Native American Blood Degree Certificate (i.e., tribal registry letter or tribal roll register number).
